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.The goals of the Child and Adult Care Food Program are to promote and protect the nutritional quality of food served to persons who are physically and mentally handicapped in the facility in which they are provided, to contribute to the physical and mental health of the recipient and to assure that proper nutrition is provided through the planning and procurement of food services. A child's diet can affect his or her health and development. A healthy diet can help a child gain weight, grow physically, and grow mentally. Good nutrition can help a child learn. The benefits of good nutrition are many. Research shows that children who eat well and are not overweight are more likely to be healthy and less likely to be overweight as adults. A healthy diet is also important for people of all ages, including pregnant women, children, and adults. A healthy diet can prevent certain health problems, such as high blood pressure, diabetes, and heart disease. If you are a person with disabilities, your doctor, dietitian, or other medical or nutritional professional may recommend that you change or follow a special diet or be limited in the types or quantities of food that you may eat. A diet may be recommended for any medical reason such as a medical condition, disease, or treatment, or to support a certain activity such as working, eating, or exercising. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and other agencies offer additional information on their websites. Examples of a Special Diet There are many diets to choose from. Some of the more common are: Low-Carb Diet These diets generally restrict carbohydrates and focus on higher amounts of protein and fats. However, a number of diets include some low-carb diets that also restrict some other nutrients such as fiber. These diets may be more appropriate if you have diabetes. Low-Salt Diet A lowsalt diet may be recommended for certain groups of people, such as those with certain medical conditions and high blood pressure. A low-salt diet may restrict foods with added salt such as pickles, bread, and other processed foods. Diabetes Diet Diabetes diets generally restrict carbohydrates and sometimes also restrict other nutrients such as fiber. A diabetes diet may not include any sugar-containing foods such as regular soft drinks and some fruits. Some diabetes diets may also require you to carefully count carbohydrates and check blood sugar levels. High-Carbohydrate Diet Many diets restrict carbohydrates and

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
