BassBox Pro 6.0 OK Serial Key Keygenbfdcm.EDF, the French utility that built an early lead in the race to build a giant new nuclear reactor in France, has been slipping lately in terms of its public image. And the latest scandal involves a string of allegations, including bribery, secret meetings and a penchant for dressing up as an artist. The latest episode is a lawsuit, recently filed in the French capital by a woman who alleges that senior company officials -- including one of its current president, Jean-Bernard Lévy -- had paid for prostitutes at her home. It is the latest in a series of high-profile accusations, which together have raised questions about the kind of culture that has pervaded the firm since it was founded in 1986 by the Frenchman André Chourot, a onetime advertising executive. From 1993 until his retirement last September, Mr. Chourot served as EDF's deputy chairman. On his watch, the company built up a reputation as one of the most powerful business leaders in France, at one point spending roughly one-fifth of its annual revenues on construction contracts and buildings. Yet EDF, which was fined almost \$8 billion last year for running dangerously short of electricity when Europe faced blackouts, has recently faced serious criticism for

other reasons. It has been charged with using so-called performance-related payments to senior staff and top executives to exert influence over industrial decisions, even though EDF had no role in managing the electricity market. (The French competition authority found no evidence of collusion, however.) In October,

EDF and GDF Suez, the state-controlled utility that runs the nuclear reactor, were found guilty of violating European Union antitrust rules for having colluded on price. They were fined a combined \$8 million. The company also faces a raft of problems at home. Two years ago, the French state said it was cutting the company's electricity subsidies and imposing caps on the price it can charge for electricity. A year ago, France's utility regulator, ANEMO, said EDF had been abusing its monopoly by charging too much for the electricity it produces. The company, which reported \$24.8 billion in revenues in 2010, is also under

investigation by French and German prosecutors for a variety of alleged tax crimes, including the disappearance of \$2.2 billion in earnings. Some of these have been tied to Mr. Chourot's son, a

former EDF executive named Yves. (

The loss of a loved one can precipitate debilitating distress that includes symptoms of depression, acute sadness, and grief. Most bereavement interventions focus on how to lessen the psychological impact of loss, and clinical treatment of depression or grief involves pharmacologic interventions that can have serious side effects. There is a need for treatment approaches that are less complex, have few side effects, and produce lasting, positive change. There is some evidence that meditation can be effective in

reducing feelings of stress, depression, and pain in health care and hospice settings. There is also evidence that meditation is an effective form of self-healing for those who experience distress and suffering. Preliminary evidence from our laboratory suggests that a mindfulness-based program - Mindfulness-based Mind Fitness Training (MMFT) - can reduce stress and depression in bereaved individuals. One of the goals of the proposed study is to determine if MMFT can also be an effective intervention to reduce stress and depression in the bereaved.
