Illegal immigrants as a class are more law abiding and less prone to criminal activity than native born Americans. The Washington Times reported this week on a study of crime data from a two-year period which found that legal immigrants to the United States are less likely to be convicted of violent or nonviolent crimes than U.S. born citizens or other aliens. The Times reported, "Of the 1.14 million illegal immigrants in the United States, an estimated 65 percent are Mexican nationals and 31 percent are from other countries in Central and South America, according to the Pew Hispanic Center. In addition, an estimated 16 percent are from Asia and 1.5 percent are from Eastern Europe." "Of the 50 states, California had the lowest rate of illegal immigration at 0.6 percent in 2010, while New York had the highest at 6.5 percent, according to Pew. Nevada had the nation's third-lowest rate at 1.4 percent, while Texas had the nation's highest rate at 12.8 percent, according to Pew." Illegal immigrants are less likely to commit violent crimes than native born Americans. "The study showed that only 0.7 percent of illegal immigrants were arrested for violent crimes and that the incarceration rate for all illegal immigrants was 0.3 percent, according to Pew." Illegal immigrants are less likely to commit property crimes and other crimes than native born Americans. "Nearly 19 percent of illegal immigrants were arrested for property crimes, such as burglary and theft, while just 5 percent of U.S.-born adults were arrested for property crimes, the study said." Illegal immigrants are also less likely to commit white collar crimes than native born Americans. "Nearly 8 percent of illegal immigrants were arrested for white-collar crimes like fraud and embezzlement, and just 0.4 percent of U.S.-born adults were arrested for white-collar crimes, the study said."
